

Measuring the Impact of SPG spending

Sports Premium Grant 2013/2014

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to provide new primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

This funding was paid to school in two parts 7/12ths in November 2013 and 5/12ths in April 2014/15 financial year.

- 4 day training course

3. Sports coaches
