

Proposed spending of Sports Premium 2016-2017

During each academic year, every primary school receives a Primary PE & Sport Premium Grant from the government. Each school receives a different amount of money depending on the number of children it has.

The grant is given to help schools develop their PE curriculum and to increase the number of children participating in PE and sport in and out of school time.

Below is a breakdown of how we have spent our grant money so far and how we plan to spend it during the rest of this academic year.

2016-2017 This funding is paid to school in two parts 7/12ths in November 2016 and 5/12ths in May 2017 financial year.

How we plan to spend the Funding:

- 1) Further developing the role of the PE co-ordinator through partnerships and training.
- 2) Whole staff CPD by the PE co-ordinator.
- 3) Sports Coaches; Steps2Sport are working with us to offer high quality, professional PE lessons and sports coaching during lunchtimes and after school. Coaching is timetabled for all children in years 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 all year round to increase participation and engage least active children in sport.
 - Specialist rugby coaches working alongside teachers to improve teaching and skills knowledge.
 - Partnership with the local secondary school: their PE teachers are coming to train play leaders and a School Sports Organising Crew to encourage participation and have pupil voice on what clubs they would like to have in school.
 - Zuu Chimps to work alongside all year groups to provide a new and exciting way to deliver PE.
 - Yoga bugs to work with Reception staff and children.

- 4) Embedding the house-point system to increase positive attitudes towards PE and further develop the agreed house values of collaboration, equality, perseverance, courage, inspiration, excellence and respect.
- 5) Cover for PE co-ordinator to jointly observe lessons, give feedback and provide next steps for staff.
- 6) Further develop curriculum provision and core tasks for assessment.
- 7) Transport to and from inter-school tournaments.
